The IFSCC – what is it and why does it matter?

Aside from a long name that for some reason reminds me of Star Trek, the International Federation of the Societies of Cosmetic Chemists (IFSCC) is indeed our Mother Ship. Our membership in the Society of Cosmetic Chemist automatically makes us members of the IFSCC. Many of didn't know that and certainly don't take advantage of that, me included.

This past year I helped out as a liaison between the SCC and the IFSCC, trying to improve the relationship and spread the word about the IFSCC and what it means to us. The IFSCC Praesidium held their mid-year meeting this past June in NY at our SCC offices. We arranged this meeting to be held during one of our local NYSCC meetings so the Praesidium could attend the meeting. The IFSCC also sponsored an international speaker for this local SCC NYC meeting. It was a great chance for the local SCC chapter to get to know the IFSCC board.

For the rest of us, what is the IFSCC and how does it relate to us?

The IFSCC was formalized in Brussels, Belgium on September 8th, 1959. At that time there were only 8 countries entering the Federation. Today, 47 Societies representing 57 countries have met the high standards of scientific and educational qualifications of the IFSCC. The number of individual members in the Federation now exceeds 15,000 and this number is growing. The US Society makes up 26% of this number. We are part of this number.

The aims of the IFSCC:

- to advance Cosmetic Science
- to help elevate the professional status of cosmetic science and technology worldwide by providing and promoting educational and scientific programs and activities
- to encourage fundamental research work by universities and by independent workers in any and all fields that may add to the knowledge of cosmetic science
- to coordinate by correspondence, interchange of information and in other ways, the work and efforts of the autonomous member societies
- to cement relationships by reporting on activities in the various autonomous member societies
- to exchange information on any standardized procedures that may be adopted with regard to analyses of raw materials or finished products, efficiency of products, etc. and to participate in any effort to adopt such procedures internationally
- to publicize within the member societies and in the technical and other press of the various countries, the activities of the societies of all lands
- to hold congresses, seminars and meetings on an international scale, to invite speakers from any country, whenever feasible and give publicity to all meetings well in advance
- to sponsor awards of an international character for outstanding achievement in research, publication, or other work on behalf of the cosmetic sciences.





The IFSCC – what is it and why does it matter? (cont)

The IFSCC is governed by a bicameral system. If we go back to our Political Science classes, this is a system of government in which the legislature is comprised of 2 houses. In the case of the IFSCC, we have the "Council" and the "Praesidium". The Council is made up of single members from the various societies that are voted in to speak on our behalf. Our Council members representing the SCC are Amy Wyatt and Martha Tate. The Praesidium is made up of the officers of the Federation, who are elected by the Council. The Council and Praesidium meet together annually in the fall, and the Praesidium also meets in the Spring (or in the case of this year it was June, in NYC).

What are the advantages to being part of the IFSCC?

Before writing this article I decided it was time for me to check out the IFSCC website and to register as an online member. It took approximately 4 minutes. We've all received our SCC Renewal notice in the past couple of weeks. On it you will find your SCC membership number. That's all you need to register with the IFSCC website (IFSCC.org). You'll get a very quick response and will receive a password to the site.

Once you're in you have immediate access to:

- Recent Scientific Articles published by the IFSCC
- Recent issue of the IFSCC Magazine
- Information on the upcoming IFSCC meeting in Paris, October 27-30, 2014

It's that easy.

So go ahead and renew your SCC membership knowing that it's a 2-for-1, an SCC membership and IFSCC membership.

It's a very exciting time to be in our industry. Companies and consumers alike are becoming more aware of the potential of our formulations and this industry. We now have the opportunity not only to improve appearances but also to create awareness of environmental and societal issues around the world.

I'm very proud of what our industry is doing. It's all of you who can take us to the next level!
